### STUDENT HIGHLIGHTS




CARE student, Stephen Guevara accomplished one of her goals and took advantage of the opportunity to study abroad!

### Are You Ready For Transfer?

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This is the time of year that much needs to get done if you are planning to transfer next year. October 1st is the kick-off date for CSU applications (10/01-11/30) and November 1st is the kick-off date for UC applications (11/01-11/30). Application due dates to private universities vary, however, generally speaking, the process begins around October and may carry into early next year. By now you should know if you are ready to apply for next year. If you have any doubts make an EOPS/CARE counseling appointment to evaluate your transfer readiness. Some majors/programs may require supplemental applications and/or auditions and have specific selection criteria. The UCs will require you to provide personal responses to specific questions. Private universities will likely require personal statements. EOPS is providing a couple of CSU/UC application workshops.

Our campus Transfer Center is providing numerous CSU/UC application workshops as well as other transfer related topics/tips workshops throughout the months of October and November. You can view dates/times as well as other vast transfer resources on our campus website under the resources tab to link to Transfer Center. SIGN-UP NOW!! It's best that you see an EOPS/CARE counselor first for transfer readiness ASAP!! One on one appointments are limited at the transfer center.

If you will be transferring next year there is a strong likelihood that you will be earning one or more associate degrees before you depart. Verification of potential degrees earned should be verified during your counseling appointment. Graduation petitions will need to be submitted by you to the Admissions and Records office this semester or no later than early spring 2019.







### OCTOBER RECOGNIZES MENTAL HEALTH DAY

Mental Health Day is acknowledged worldwide on October 10th. Unfortunately, suffering from a mental illness still holds somewhat of a stigma in our communities today. It is important to remember that the onset of a mental illness can happen after a person experiences a certain trauma or event in their lives that will trigger it. Not everyone who suffers from a mental illness is born with a mental illness.

A friend suffering from a mental illness may appreciate your support in the following ways:

>> Take them outside. Fresh air and some sunshine can lift anyone's mood. You will realize that your friend may be reluctant at first, but don't take no for an answer.

>> **Do some chores.** Folding laundry and/or washing dishes are tasks that most people don't enjoy. For someone who is depressed these tasks may seem daunting. You will make their day!

>> Listen. For some folks, this is easier said than done, but it's important to "just listen" and do not interrupt. Instead, ask how you can be of any help.
