During the forty-seven years of its existence, the Theatre Department at Los Angeles City College has undergone innumerable changes, all of them calculated to improve the existing system. In the Fall of 1975, with the blessings of our enlightened administration, we established a THEATRE ACADEMY.

For the first time since the department was established in 1929, we are interviewing and auditioning each prospective acting student. Only those who appear to have the language skills, the voice, the physical equipment, and, most important, sound reasons for wanting to commit themselves to the rigors of professional theatre training are admitted.

Each semester the student's progress is evaluated and a determination made as to whether he should be encouraged to continue. Consequently, third year students constitute a highly selected group of young actors who are encouraged in every way to make the transition to the business of professional theatre.

The training program is designed so that there is a logical step by step progression in the transitional process. First year students are apprentices, concentrating on a heavy class load and production activities other than acting. Second year students are journeymen, still carrying a heavy class load but now engaged in limited, but demanding, production acting assignments. Third year students are COMPANY members whose training consists primarily of acting assignments; class work is determined on an individual need basis. Each year two or three members of the COMPANY will be invited to return, not as regular students, but as actors in residence, a paid, professional engagement. Augmenting this group will be guest artists, giving the transitional student an opportunity to work with individuals who have already made the transition to the professional theatre and are, consequently, in a position to help our young actors, through advice and example, to make that difficult transition.

These changes were not instituted because we were not successful with things as they were. As a matter of fact, this department has for almost fifty years been highly regarded as a professional theatre training institution. In 1974, a year before this new program was put in action, we received a Special Award from the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle, "For Maintaining Consistently High Standards of Programming and Production." We were honored by this unprecedented citation, but not lulled into complacency. Conversely, we have critically attacked the program that was cited and the changes that have been discussed were the result.
