The mission of the LACC **Nursing Department** is to educate students for entry level registered nursing positions in a variety of multicultural health care settings within the community.

Los Angeles City College accepts 20-40 Nursing students for enrollment every Fall and Spring. We offer an Associate of Science Degree in a 2-year full-time program that includes theory and clinical courses over 4 days a week. Once admitted, this program is designed to be completed in four semesters for non-licensed candidates. Clinical experiences will include the opportunity for students to participate in nursing care and treatments of clients in hospitals and other health care facilities.
