To complete the major in Spanish, it is required that **eighteen or more units** of classes be chosen from below. These must include **Spanish 4, 9, and 10**, and all classes must be completed with a satisfactory grade of “C” or better.

Brief Course Descriptions:

- Spanish 1** - Basic Spanish grammar and vocabulary.
- Spanish 2** - Continuation of basic grammar and vocabulary.

Spanish 3 - Review of grammar learned, as well as the accent rules, some new grammar points, reading, and writing.

Spanish 4- Continuation of Spanish 3, reviews grammar learned, the accent rules, new grammar points, reading of short stories, and writing.

Spanish 5 - Grammar, literature (theatre as a performing art and literary genre, and the essay), and writing.

Spanish 6 - Grammar, literature (short story and poetry), and writing.

Spanish 8- Practice in oral expression based on daily life experiences, films, short stories, and articles in periodicals.

Spanish 9 - This course is **taught in English**. Covers the history, geography, and culture of Spain.

Spanish 10- This course is **taught in English**. Covers the history, geography, and culture of Latin America.

Spanish 11 - Covers the literature of Spain from medieval times to the present. (Poema del mio Cid, Don Quijote de la Mancha, poems by Federico García Lorca, works during the Spanish Civil War, during the dictatorship of Francisco Franco and after the death of Francisco Franco.)

Spanish 15 - Covers Latin-American literature from the colonial period to the present (Cristóbal Colón, Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz, José Hernández, Rubén Darío, Pablo Neruda, Julio Cortázar, Gabriel García Márquez, etc).

Spanish 21- 1st half of Spanish 1. Spanish 21 and 22 together are equivalent to Spanish 1.

Spanish 22 - 2nd half of Spanish 1. Spanish 21 and 22 together are equivalent to Spanish 1.

Spanish 35- Equivalent to Spanish 1 for native speakers. The class is for students who speak Spanish, but wish to improve in areas like accents, vocabulary, and writing.

Spanish 36- Equivalent to Spanish 2 for native speakers. Continuation of Spanish 35.
