





Acquire a broad education: Responses by ethnicity




Acquire a broad education: Responses by gender

Contribute to the welfare of your community: Responses by ethnicity






Contribute to the welfare of your community: Responses by gender



Develop a personal code of values and ethics: Responses by ethnicity







Write, speak, and express myself clearly and effectively: Responses by ethnicity




Write, speak, and express myself clearly and effectively: Responses by gender






Think critically and analytically: Responses by gender










Solve numerical problems: Responses by gender
