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LACC ASSOCIATE DEGREE – GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (2023 - 2024)

- I. Unit Requirement: Minimum 60 units of course credit in a selected curriculum. (Administrative Procedure 4100)
- II. **Scholarship Requirement:** A "C" (2.0) grade average or higher in all work attempted in the curriculum upon which the degree is based. (Administrative Procedure 4100)

III. Competency Requirements:

The following courses and examinations are approved to meet the competency for the Associate Degree for all students entering fall 2009 and after. (Administrative Procedure 4100)

A. Reading and Written Expression

- 1. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher Freshman Composition from any California Community College or the equivalent from any United States regionally accredited institution with a grade of C- or higher.
- 2. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher a California Community College course that meets the California State University General Education Breadth (CSUGE Breadth) requirement in Area A2: Written Communication and/or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) in Area 1A: English Composition.
- 3. Achieving a satisfactory score on an external examination (such as, but not limited to an Advanced Placement Exam) as specified in LACCD Administrative Procedures.

B. Mathematics

- 1. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher any course from a California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) Course Basic (CB) Code of "One Level Below Transfer" or higher with a TOP code beginning with 17.
- 2. Verification of passing with a grade of C- or higher, or Credit/Pass/Satisfactory if equivalent to a grade of C- or higher per sending institution's transcript key, a mathematics course at or above the level of the course typically known as Intermediate Algebra or the equivalent from any United States regionally accredited secondary or post-secondary institution.
- 3. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher a California Community College course that meets the California State University General Education Breadth (CSUGE Breadth) requirement in Area B4: Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning and/or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) in Area 2A: Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning.
- 4. Achieving a satisfactory score (using a DAS-approved scoring-method) on a DAS-approved District Mathematics Competency Examination.
- 5. Achieving a satisfactory score on an external examination (such as, but not limited to an Advanced Placement Exam) as specified in LACCD Administrative Procedures.
- *** Note: For students who started prior to fall 2019, have maintained continuous enrollment, and have placed into any transferable-level math, they have met math competency for all eligible associate degrees.
- IV. **Ethnic Studies Requirement:** Students who are first-time students as of fall 2023 or later must complete a transfer-level course (minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units with a grade of C or P or higher) in ethnic studies from a U.S. regionally accredited institution. Courses may include any listed ethnic courses for GE Patterns LACC Areas B or C, CSUGE Area F, or IGETC Area 7. (Administrative Procedure 4100)
- V. **Residence Requirement:** Completion of at least 12 units of work in residence and attendance at the college. Exceptions may be made for injustice or undue hardship. (Administrative Procedure 4100)
- VI. **Major Requirements:** Per Title 5 and AP 4100, a minimum of 18 units in a single or related field must be completed to graduate. For students entering fall 2009 or after, each course counted towards the major or area of emphasis requirement must be completed with a C grade or better. (Administrative Procedure 4100)
- VII. **General Education Requirements:** Students may satisfy their associate degree general education requirements by completing either the LACC G.E. pattern, IGETC, CSU GE-Breadth, IGETC for STEM, CSUGE for STEM, an associate degree from a U.S. regionally accredited institution (Students must meet current LACCD math and English competency), or a bachelor's degree or higher. (Administrative Procedure 4100)
- VIII. Catalogue Year and Concurrent Enrollment: Please refer to Administrative Procedure 4100 or contact the Counseling department.

SUMMARY

- 1. Minimum of 60 degree applicable units with a minimum 2.0 GPA
- 2. Since fall 2009 all required courses for the major must be completed with grade of "C" or better or "P" if taken on a Pass/Non-Pass basis. All substitutions for major courses must be approved by the appropriate academic department chair or faculty designee (Articulation Officer).
- 3. Courses listed in more than one subject area may only be applied once, i.e., you may only use it in one general education area (exceptions for E1 and E2).
- 4. Coursework from outside LACCD and external exams (e.g., AP, IB, CLEP) are not awarded general education or competency credit until official documents are delivered to and verified by LACC Admissions.
