- Area 7 waived for students who complete a degree in Nursing.
- Area 7 waived for students who have completed Public Service Academy training as determined by local college protocol.
- Area 7 waived for Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT), Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVN), and Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) as determined by local college protocol.
- Area 7 satisfied with credit for military service: Military Personnel on Active Duty: documentation must verify at least 181 days of active duty.
  - Former Military Personnel currently NOT on Active Duty: Active Duty.
  - Documentation (DD 214) must indicate student's length of service, which must include 181 days of active duty.
- For high unit majors: After all double-counting of major units with general education units is completed, LACCD General Education area 4a American Institutions and/or area 7 Lifelong Learning and Self Development minimum unit requirement are waived as follows:
  - 34-36 units: one area waived (student choice of area 4a or area 7)
  - 37 or more units: two areas waived (area 4a and area 7)

The LACCD associate-level general education plan is appropriate for students planning to earn an associate degree who do not plan to transfer to a baccalaureate granting institution. Although courses may be listed in multiple general education areas (1-7), a course can be given credit in only one GE subject area. This advisement sheet can be modified or updated from time to time. Please consult with a counselor regarding which catalog year and GE pattern may be more beneficial and appropriate to graduate. Per Administrative Procedure 4100:

- **Unit Requirement:** Minimum 60 units of course credit in a selected curriculum (i.e., major, GE, competency requirements).
- **Scholarship Requirement:** A "C" (2.0) grade average or higher in all work attempted in the curriculum upon which the degree is based. A "C" is defined as a minimum 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale.
- **Residence Requirement:** Completion of at least 12 units of work in residence and attendance at a LACCD college. Exceptions may be made due to injustice or undue hardship.
- **Major Requirements:** A minimum of 18 units in a single or related field must be completed to graduate. For students entering fall 2009 or after, each course counted towards the major or area of emphasis requirement must be completed with a C grade or better.

- **General Education Requirements:** Students may satisfy their associate degree general education requirements by completing the LACC G.E. pattern, or

    - Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC)
    - WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC)
